Adverbs of Frequency
(Advérbios de Frequência)

- 100% – always – *She likes dancing. She **always** goes to the night club to dance.*
- 90% – usually – *They **usually** quarrel. I rarely see them in good terms with each other.*
- 80% – normally / generally – *I **normally** go to the gym.*
- 70% – often* / frequently – *They **often** go out for dinner.*
- 50% – sometimes – *I don't mind going to the theater. I **sometimes** go with my husband.*
- 30% – occasionally – *I **occasionally** eat junk food.*
- 10% – seldom – *I **seldom** read the newspaper.*
- 5% – hardly ever / rarely – *I **hardly ever** drink alcohol.*
- 0% – never – *I **never** go to the cinema. I don't like it. / Never say never. (proverb)*

A posição dos Advérbios de Frequência

Geralmente, os advérbios de frequência vêm antes do verbo principal, exceto quando o verbo principal for o verbo “to be”:

- *I **sometimes** visit my uncle.*
- *We **often** see your brother at school.*
- *They are **seldom** at work. (are= conjugação do “verbo to be”. Por isso **seldom** aparece depois do verbo)*

Occasionally, sometimes, often, frequently e usually também podem ser usados no início ou no final da frase:

- ***Sometimes** they visit him.*
- *I miss him **occasionally**.*

Rarely e seldom também podem ser usados no final da frase (geralmente acompanhados de “very”):

- *We see them **rarely**.*
- *John eats meat **very seldom**.*

ADVERBS OF FREQUENCY

100%	Always	She always goes to the night club to dance.
90%	Usually	They usually quarrel.
80%	Normally	I normally go to the gym.
70%	Often	They often go out for dinner.
50%	Sometimes	I sometimes go with my husband.
30%	Occasionally	I occasionally eat junk food.
10%	Seldom	I seldom read the newspaper.
5%	Hardly ever	I hardly ever drink alcohol.
0%	Never	I never go to the cinema. I don't like it.



How often

Para perguntar a alguém a frequência que a pessoa realiza alguma atividade, usamos a expressão "How often..."

Exemplos:

How often do you sleep late? (**Com que frequência** você dorme tarde?)

I **always** sleep late. (Eu **sempre** durmo tarde)

How often does your mother eat fruits? (**Com que frequência** sua mãe come frutas?)

She **rarely** eats fruits. (Ela **raramente** come frutas)
